A former chief trial lawyer for the Lackawanna County District Attorney's office, the primary focus of Mr. Moran's private practice is in civil litigation and the representation of victims of serious, catastrophic and fatal injuries. He also handles the defense of serious criminal matters on a selective basis. He is General Counsel for Litigation for Lackawanna County.

For the fifth consecutive year, Mr. Moran has earned the designation as a Pennsylvania Super Lawyer. Super Lawyers are selected by Philadelphia Magazine after a multi-phased selection process that includes peer nominations; research of each lawyer based on 12 specified indicators of peer recognition and professional achievement; a blue ribbon panel peer evaluation by practice areas; and, finally, selection of lawyers achieving the highest point totals

from 4 firm-sized categories. Fewer than 5% of lawyers practicing in the state are selected for inclusion among Pennsylvania Super Lawyers. The addition of Mr. Moran brings to 8 the total number of Pennsylvania Super Lawyers at Lenahan & Dempsey.

In 1994 Attorney Moran was awarded a dual certification by the National Board of Trial Advocacy as a Civil and Criminal Trial Advocate. The National Board of Trial Advocacy's standards for certification include requiring a trial lawyer to furnish evidence of good standing in the lawyer's state of admission, substantial involvement in several enumerated areas of trial advocacy, and substantial participation in continuing legal education and the development of the law. The Board also requires the lawyer to submit references from peers and judges, and to pass a written examination that tests his or her knowledge of civil or criminal trial law—or, in Mr. Moran's case, both.

Mr. Moran has been admitted to the bars of the Supreme Court of the United States of America, the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania and both state and federal trial and appellate courts situated in Pennsylvania.

He is a graduate of the University of Scranton (magna cum laude) and the Villanova University School of Law. Married to the former Kathryn Conaboy, Mr. Moran and his wife are the parents of 5 children.
