
Summer Weather Brings Motorcycle Accidents

It's a sad fact of summer - the good weather brings out more motorcycle riders and in turn that means more and more people suffer serious personal injuries in motorcycle accidents.

Thousands of Pennsylvanians enjoy the freedom offered by motorcycles. Here are just a few tips from Lenahan & Dempsey and The Pennsylvania State Police to help motorists and motorcycle riders keep safe this summer:

1. Motorists need to be aware that the nice summer weather will bring out more motorcycle riders. The State Police remind you that motorcycles often are hidden in a motorist's blind spot or masked by objects or backgrounds outside a vehicle. That means motorists should double-check blind spots and rearview and side mirrors before changing lanes or making turns.
2. Consider wearing a helmet. While helmets are not required by law, they can save lives and prevent very serious injuries. Speaking recently with a radiologist on the subject of helmets, he said he commonly sees very serious and often deadly injuries that would have been prevented or mitigated by the use of a helmet.

3. If you insist on not wearing a helmet, remember Pennsylvania law mandates the use of protective headgear unless the motorcyclist is 21 years of age or older and has been licensed to operate a motorcycle for not less than two full calendar years or has successfully completed a motorcycle safety course approved by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation or the Motorcycle Safety Foundation.

4. There is other equipment you can wear to keep safe while on a motorcycle. The State Police note that riders can protect themselves by wearing face protection and brightly colored clothing, including long-sleeved shirts, full-fingered gloves, long pants and foot protection that cover the ankle.

5. If you are seriously injured while operating or riding a motorcycle, you must take a number of steps to protect your rights. Lenahan & Dempsey can help you protect your rights.
